The final stage of the program is follow-up and continuing support in college for GED graduates. Depending on previous educational levels, new students may enroll in the appropriate phase as needed. You are eligible: 1) If you are 16 to 25 and have dropped out of a Texas public high school, and 2) If you are willing to commit to work at a college level and finish what you start. This program also offers assistance with transportation, childcare, job training and placement and other emergency financial needs.
