Free guidance to help reunite Texas families

A new Texas law helps parents who have had their custody terminated by **CPS**, including formerly incarcerated parents, regain the rights to their children. Local legal and advocacy organizations are hosting free legal clinics to help reunite families and support parents involved in the system.



New family reunification law

HB 2926 was signed into law in 2021. It allows Texans whose parental rights were involuntarily terminated by **CPS** – including due to incarceration – to file a petition requesting the court to reinstate their rights.

The family reunification law was championed by formerly incarcerated women and passed with bipartisan support.
