Among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Thomas:


- 84% of Black defendants (115 out of 137)
- 52% of Hispanic White defendants (51 out of 98)
- 75% of Non-Hispanic White defendants (53 out of 71)

were detained per night based on inability to pay

Last week, among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Thomas, 84% of Black defendants (115 out of 137 on an average night), 52% of Hispanic White defendants (51 out of 98 on an average night), and 75% of Non-Hispanic White defendants (53 out of 71 on an average night) were detained in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Thomas's racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. Her racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County.
